RAINY DAY DETOUR: BELEM DISTRICT

In the event of inclement weather, head to the riverfront Belem neighborhood, where a host of museums and indoor sites are within close proximity of each other. Stop by the Pastéis de Belém for famous snack.

Jerónimos Monastery ♦

Stunning Manueline Gothic structure and adjacent chapel home to the tombs of Vasco da Gama and Camões.

Museum of the President of the Republic ♦

For any political science buff, this small museum is on the grounds of the Presidential Palace, and features presidential portraits, gifts to the republic, and features the political history of Portugal.

Museu Nacionale dos Coches

70+ royal stagecoaches and carriages in a space nearly the size of a city block.

Quake

An interactive museum experience about the 1755 Lisbon earthquake.

Feira da Ladra

Antique and flea market, held every Tuesday and Saturday, usually rain or shine. These weekly markets are a great place to find deals on excellent Portuguese cotton sheets, towels, and robes, and the occasional antique.

Granado & Claus Porto

We love these Brazilian and Portuguese soap and scentmakers.

Pingo Doce

This is one of Portugal's main grocery stores. It's good for a browse - and the best place to buy wine to take home! Multiple locations across the country.

Museu Nacional do Azulejo ♦

It's slightly out of the way (about a 10 minute ride from the airport), but if you love tiles, this is a Portuguese tile lover's dream.

National Museum of Ancient Art

A great stop for art historians, this museum houses over 40,000 pieces of art spanning over a millenium of art.

Calouste Gulbenkian Museum


One of the world's most impressive private art collections. It includes masterpieces from various periods and areas, and is surrounded by tranquil gardens. *note it is closed for renovations until July 2026.

Museum of Art, Architecture and Technology (MAAT)

Housed in a futuristic structure by British architect Amanda Levete, this multidisciplinary art and cultural destination is home to an impressive collection of contemporary Portuguese art.

Museu do Fado

A collection of music scores, records, posters, musical instruments, and other artifacts from one of the region's most important cultural legacies. They also host live performances so be sure to check on the dates that you are there.
